



2nd Parish Plan Open Day.

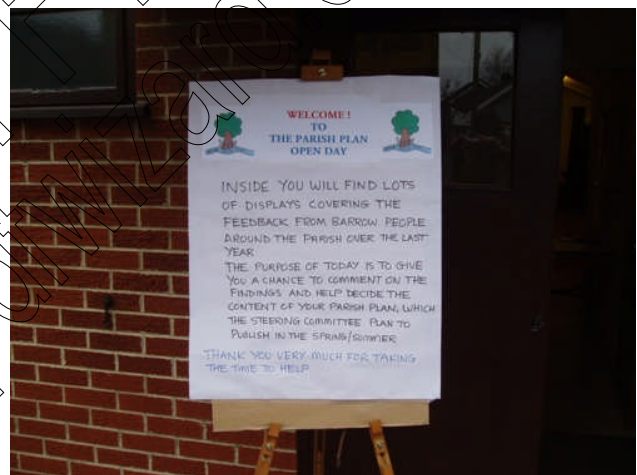

The Barrow upon Trent Parish Plan Steering Group organised a 2nd Open Day to show what responses had been received from the distribution of flyers and the results of the various questionnaires that had been completed and returned.

The Open Day was held in the Village Hall on 28th February from 10am until 2pm with some excellent displays, representatives from various associations within the village. There were excellent refreshments, competitions for the children and a free prize draw for every entrant.



Over 70 people were in attendance from around the Parish plus the 20 or so Steering Group volunteers manning the displays and providing the refreshments. A very good turnout with a large percentage of the Parish represented in some way. The welcome at the door was from Duncan Hewitt, a Parish Plan Committee member who lives in Merrybower.

Lots of very useful and interesting feedback was received from the questionnaires which were sent out last August, the responses were analysed and the results collated and placed into various group displays around the hall.

Visitors were asked to stick “smiley faces” on prepared display forms which showed their areas of particular interest and concern.



This is the section on “Law and Order” within the Parish, and Parish Council arranged and manned by Keith Slater and Anne Heathcote.

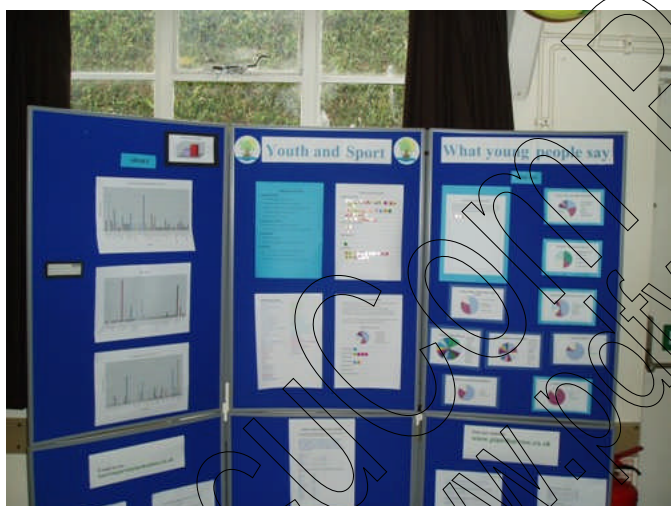
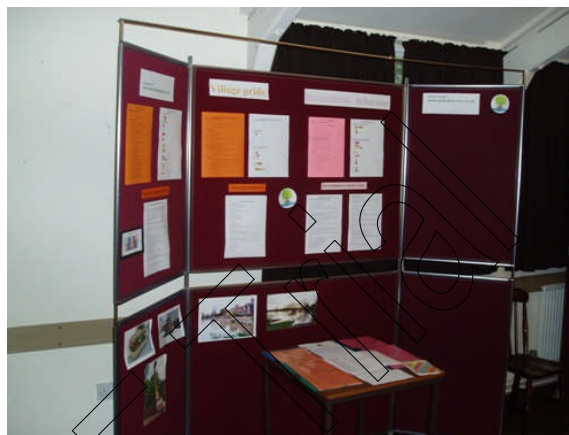
By 10.30am there were several groups of people looking at the displays and adding comments to the “comments boards”.

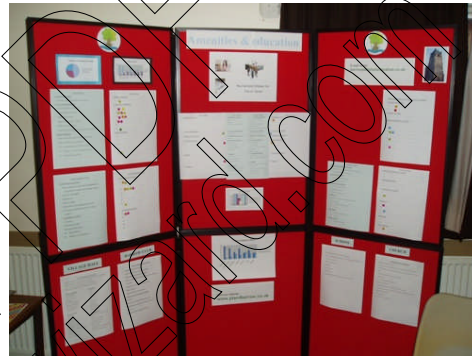
